## Prosecutor pressing motions

**BRYAN** — Williams County Prosecutor Tony Gretick reports that he has filed motions in Williams County Juvenile Court asking that the court bind four juveniles over to the grand jury for prosecution as adults.

The juveniles, three 17-year olds and a 16-year old, have been charged in juvenile court with burglary following an extensive investigation by the Williams County Sheriff's Department. They allegedly broke into the Kevin Dick residence, Route 3, Montpelier, during the night of Nov. 18.

Gretick also reports that extradition proceedings have been begun against Roosevelt O'Donnell, South Bend, Ind., who has been charged with aggravated burglary of the Larry Lucas residence, Route 5, Bryan, on Nov. 7.

## Stream preservation draws citizens group

**ARCHBOLD** — "We must not let Northwest Ohio look like India, devoid of vegetation," remarked W. P. Johnson, Stryker, as representatives of citizens' groups met here this week to discuss preservation of area streams.

Johnson has been involved in efforts to oppose the channelization of the Tiffin River. The object of the meeting was to discuss ways to preserve and protect streams from destructive channelization, ditching, and damming projects.

Representatives present, on behalf of citizens' groups totaling more than 20,000 persons, approved the formation of a new organization to be named the Northwest Ohio Rivers Council.

Founding member groups include the Sugar Creek Protection Society, the Black Swamp Audubon Society, Save the Old Portage, Tiffin River Concerned Citizens, Northwestern Ohio Natural Resources Council, Tri-

Moraine Audubon Society, the Toledo Naturalist Association, and the UAW-CAP Council.

The new organization will work in cooperation with Rivers Unlimited, a statewide group of 48 organizations, and with the Environmental Policy Center and the American Rivers Conservation Council in Washington, D.C.
