Stream preservation draws citizens group

ARCHBOLD - "We must not let Northwest Ohio look like India, devoid of vegetation," remarked W. P. Johnson, Stryker, as representatives of citizens' groups met here this week to discuss preservation of area

streams. Johnson has been involved in efforts to oppose the channelization of the Tiffin River. The object of the meeting was to discuss ways to preserve and protect streams from destructive channelization, ditching, and damming projects.

Representatives present, on behalf of citizens' groups totaling more than 20,000 persons, approved the formation of a new organization to be named the Northwest Ohio Rivers Council.

Founding member groups include the Sugar Creek Protection Society, the Black Swamp Audubon Society, Save the Old Portage, Tiffin River Concerned Citizens, Northwestern Ohio Natural Resources Council, TriMoraine Audubon Society, the Toledo Naturalist Association, and the UAW-

CAP Council. The new organization will work in cooperation with Rivers Unlimited, a statewide group of 48 organizations, and with the Environmental Policy Center and the American Rivers Conservation Council in Washington, D.C.
