Sugar Beet Wages Boosted For 1947
WASHINGTON, March 19.—(AP)—The agriculture department Wednesday increased minimum wage rates to be paid by growers an average of 7.8 per cent over last year for production of this year's sugar beet crop. Growers must pay not less than minimum rates set by the department in order to become eligible for government subsidies authorized by the sugar act of 1937.
