GENTRALIZATION PLAN VOTED BY SIX DISTRICTS

American-Tp Defeats Move to Provide New Grade School

DECISION ONE - SIDED

Bluffton-Richland District Approves Special Bond Issue

Proposals for the centralization of schools, special bond issues, or the continuance of special school levies passed in all but one of seven districts at the Tuesday election, according to unofficial Wednesday figures obtained morning at the board of elections. The Bluffton-Richland and

Lafayette-Jackson districts both approved special bond issues to provide for expansion of their present facilities of the construction of a new building, and the Bluffton - Richland voters also approved continuance of the special school tax levy. In both districts the proposals were carried by margins of three to one to five to one.

The one district recording defeat for its proposal was the American-tp section, where voters disapproved by emphatic margins the levying of a school bond issue to provide a new centralized grade school building. APPROVE LEVIES

The Beaverdam, Auglaize and Harrod districts approved the continuance of the special tax levies, and in Perry-tp a school bond issue and centralization of the grade schools carried by comfortable margins.

The proposal in the Beaverdam district was to continue the three mill levy for school purposes. In Beaverdam the vote was 154 in favor and 25 opposed, while in the Richland south district it was 93 yes and 31 no, giving totals of 253 in favor and only 56


