

DAVID MDIVANI, BROTHER FACING THEFT CHARGES

Taking Of Funds From Pacific Shore Oil Co. Cited In Indictments

BOTH RELEASED ON BAIL

Attorney For Princes States Money Involved Is Safe In Trust Fund

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 13.—(AP)—Fourteen grand theft charges today faced David and Serge Mdivani, Georgian princes and former husbands respectively of Mae Murray, film actress, and Mary McCormic, opera singer.

"They were indicted yesterday on charges of theft of funds from the Pacific Shore Oil Co., which they formerly headed.

The grand jury action culminated two days of investigation. Investigators in the oil concern were summoned in connection with their complaints earnings of the company had not been paid to them as scheduled.

\$10,000 BAIL SET

Specifically, the indictment charges the princes with having stolen \$37,074.53 from the oil company between February 13, 1931, and June of this year.

Bail for each was set at \$10,000. Speaking in behalf of her clients, Attorney Eva Covert Plummer stated:

"Every penny taken in by the Pacific Shore Oil Co. is accounted for in the books of the company and the Mdivani brothers are entirely innocent of any wrong doing. The money now involved in this affair and over which some of the unit holders are clamoring is safe in a trust fund, placed there in behalf of the stockholders.

"This statement was made to the district attorney six months ago and is as true and accurate as it was then. No moneys of any kind have been misappropriated by anyone."

POLICE CHIEF WARNS OF DANGER TO LIMA BOYS

"I am asking parents to give their children strict orders to stay off the streets with sleds. This cooperation will help as more than the general public realizes.

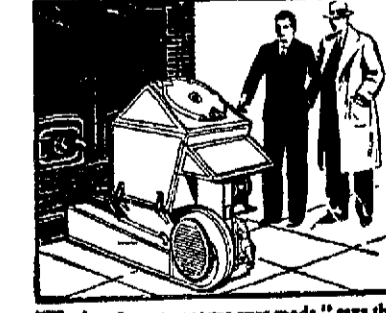
LIMA LIONS TO ATTEND MEETING IN PAULDING

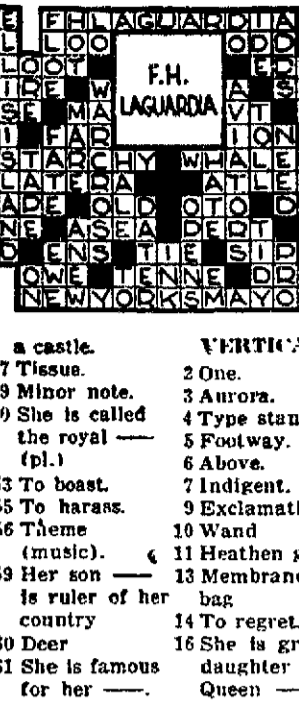

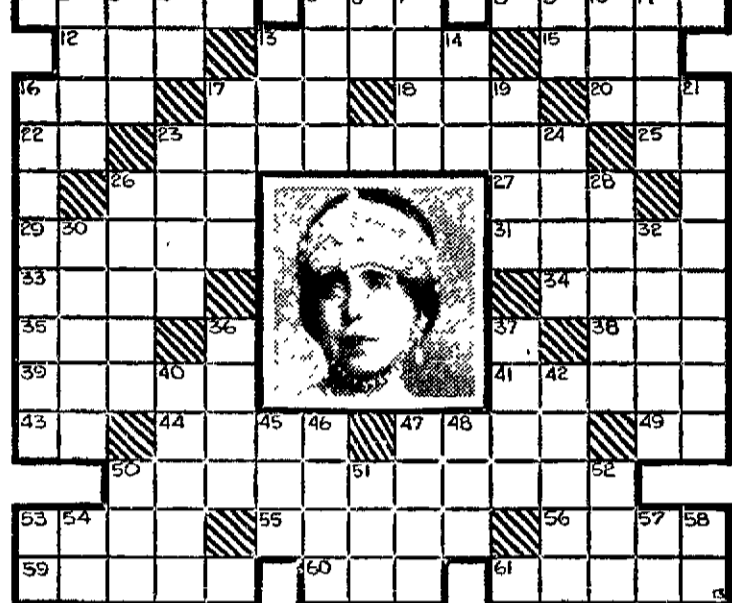

MONEY POLICY SANCTIONED BY FRANK L. KLOEB

Congressman Frank L. Kloeb, Celina, today expressed his approval of the policy of President Franklin D. Roosevelt on the money question.

In line with addresses he has made in principal cities and towns in the Fourth district since September, Kloeb declared he is in absolute accord with the steps so far taken by the administration looking to a revaluation of gold—the embargo on the shipment of gold, the ceasing of specie payments and the establishment of a free gold market.

"All of these will lead up to ultimate statutory repricing of gold," asserted Kloeb. "We cannot return to the old gold price because this would mean a return of conditions that obtained in April of this year.

"Foreign countries with their depreciated currency were taking away all our foreign trade, coming over our tariff walls, and underselling our manufacturers in domestic markets. Since April this has ceased and the carrying into effect of the present policy to reprice gold permits us to compete on a favorable basis with foreign countries in international trade. The sharp rise in exports in November is typical of the results being obtained under the new policy.

"I am absolutely opposed to

the issuance of fiat money, irredeemable paper money or printing press money in any form that has no adequate metallic backing. "At this time I am opposed to the remonetization of silver except in concert with other nations. This view may be subject to change depending on the outcome of the present policy leading to revaluation of gold."
