TWO LIMA HIGH **SCHOOLS** GIVEN CHARTERS NEW

High State Rating Received In Recognition Of Activities

New six-year charters have beer granted Central and South high schools by the Ohio Department of Education-marking the first change in the status of the Lima secondary schools in 38 years.

This announcement was made at a meeting of the board of education Monday night by Supt. J. Mc-Lean Reed, who revealed at the same time that the Lima schools had been given an "A-1" rating by R. M. Garrison, the state department's high school supervisor who recently completed an inspection here.

This rating is the highest that can be given by the state super-N150r.

Reed explained that while the new charters are effective this month, South and Central actually have been functioning as six-year high schools for nearly 20 years. Four-year charters were granted to the two schools in 1903.

Under a six-year charter, the seventh and eighth grades are included in the high school system. while under a four-year charter they are considered part of the elementary grade system.


Reed said the new charters would be presented to the high school principals with appropriate assembly programs in the near future.

The superintendent also reported that the Lima public school system had received a certificate of recognition from the National Education-assn for "high professional spirit" and for 100 per cent enrollment of local teachers in the national organization during the past 15 consecutive years.

Next meeting of the board will be held Dec. 8 in the new home economics department at South high school, with Members-Elect T. Carl Jansen and Frank Smith as special guests. The meeting will be preceded by a dinner at 6:15 o'clock. Jansen and Smith will take office Jan. 1. succeeding C. H. Pool and C. P. Neiswander






