Villa Nova Dedication Set Today

ST. MARYS — Formal dedication of the U. S. Army Reserve Center, Villa Nova, Lake St. Marys, is scheduled for today at 2:30 p.m. The center, erected on land leased from the City of St. Marys, will be known as St. Marys U. S. Army Reserve Center.

U. S. Army, political and civilian dignitaries will be here to participate in the dedication. The ceremonies will be followed by an open house during which the public will have an opportunity to inspect the center, the headquarters of the 454th Transportation Company (Amphibian Truck), and its equipment.

The St. Marys High School Band under the direction of James Williams, will open the program with a musical interlude. Mayor Howard Hollman will give the opening remarks.

Invocation by the Rev. William R. Fausey, past department chaplain of the American Legion, will be followed with the presentation of colors by Col. Robert L. Moore, the playing of the National Anthem by the band, and pledge of allegiance led by Commander Robert Haskell of the St. Marys Post, 323, American Legion.

Introduction of distinguished guests will be made by Conrad Mandross, executive secretary of the Chamber of Commerce. He will then present Congressman William M. McCulloch, the speaker of the day.

Dedicator remarks by Major Gen. Charles E. Beauchamp, commanding general of the U. S. Army Corps, will precede the unveiling of the plaque by Col. Arnold F. Reiber, naming the installation as the St. Marys U. S. Army Reserve Center.

Ribbon-cutting ceremony by Major Gen. Beauchamp and Col. Reiber, chairman of the Chamber of Commerce Veterans committee, will follow the benediction by the Rev. William Shields, C.P.P.S.

The public will then be invited into the center for open house and refreshments.

Preceding the dedication ceremonies a luncheon will be held for the visiting dignitaries at the American Legion Home at 12:15 p.m.

The St. Marys Boat Club will hold a boat parade at 1:30 p.m. Capt. J. W. Betcher is commanding officer of the 454th Transportation Company composed of Army Reserve officers and men from this area.

Priest Marks Anniversary

FT. JENNINGS — Father Hugh Ulrich, C.P.P.S. celebrates the 25th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood today with a Solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Fort Jennings.

Father Ulrich was born at Ottoville, July 5, 1910. He is the son of Mrs. F. J. Ulrich and the late Mr. Ulrich of Fort Jennings.

In 1924 he entered the seminary at Burkettsville, Ohio. He continued his studies at St. Joseph's College, Rensselaer, Indiana, and finished at St. Charles Seminary, Carthage, Ohio. He was ordained May 10, 1936.

The first two years of his priesthood were spent at Brunnerdale Canton, as an instructor. Since that time he has been on the missions band conducting missions and retreats. He has made his residence in St. Anthony's parish, Detroit.

Following the mass, he will be honored with a dinner for the clergy, relatives and friends. From 3:30 to 5 p.m. there will be open house and reception in the auditorium of the new school, all friends are invited.

Jurors Called

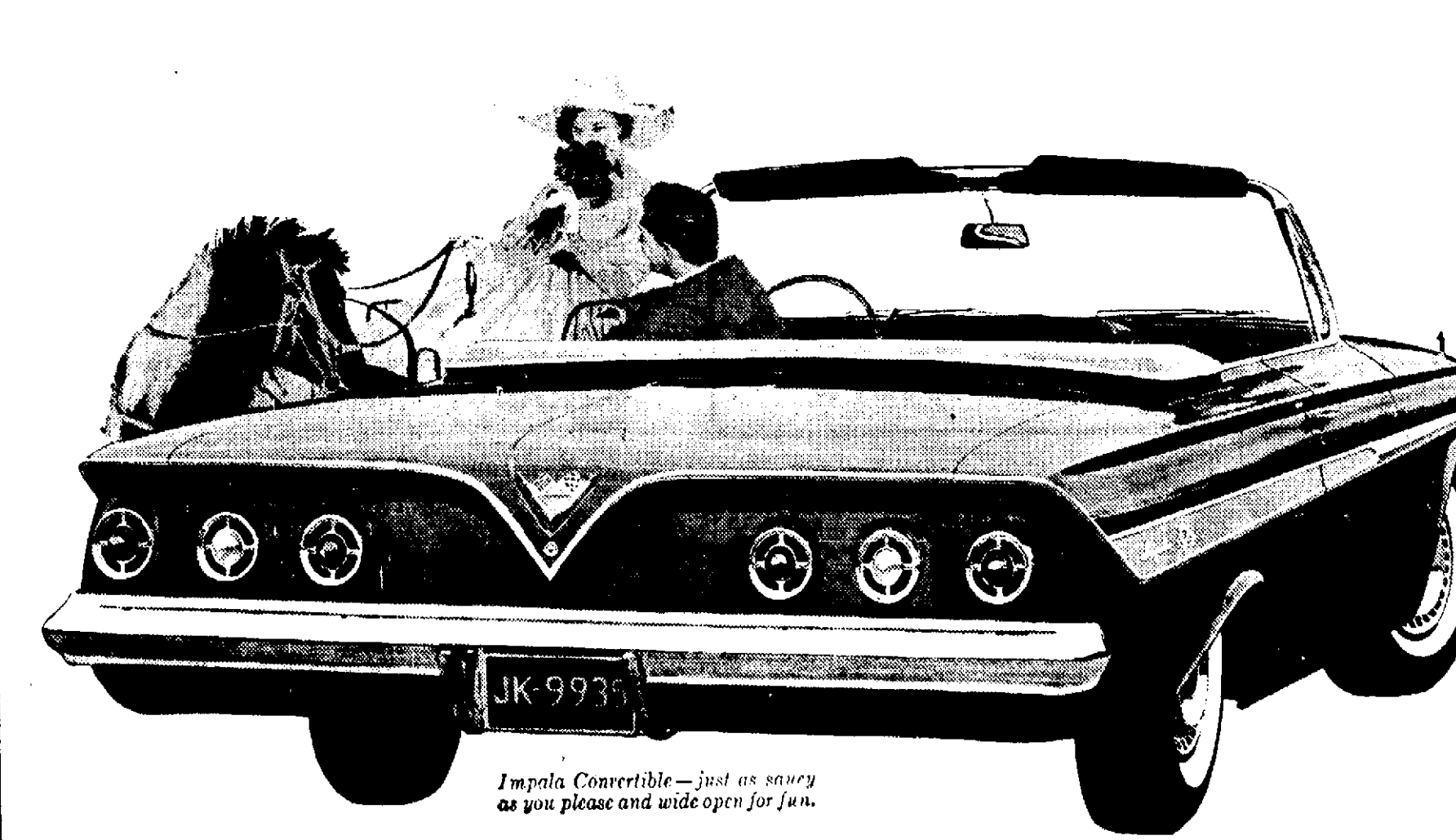
