Hey, Muscle Men, Are You In Shape?

Attention Lima area athletes: Are you "too pooped to pop?" If so, it's not necessarily tired blood. Maybe you're out of shape! According to Fred Howard, recreational leader at Bradford Center, being in shape for one sport doesn't mean you're in top con-

dition for another. He put it like this: "Every sport requires more use of certain muscles than others. Just because you're in good condition for football doesn't mean you are for baseball." Howard also agreed with an American Medical Association report that claims one's ultimate is limited by the physiological capacity of the body systems involved. For example, he said, a child or youth requires more exercise than adult because of growth needs. "Neither children nor adults get enough exercise today," Howard added. "They do too much riding and not enough walking."

Gen. Harrison Talk May Attract 400

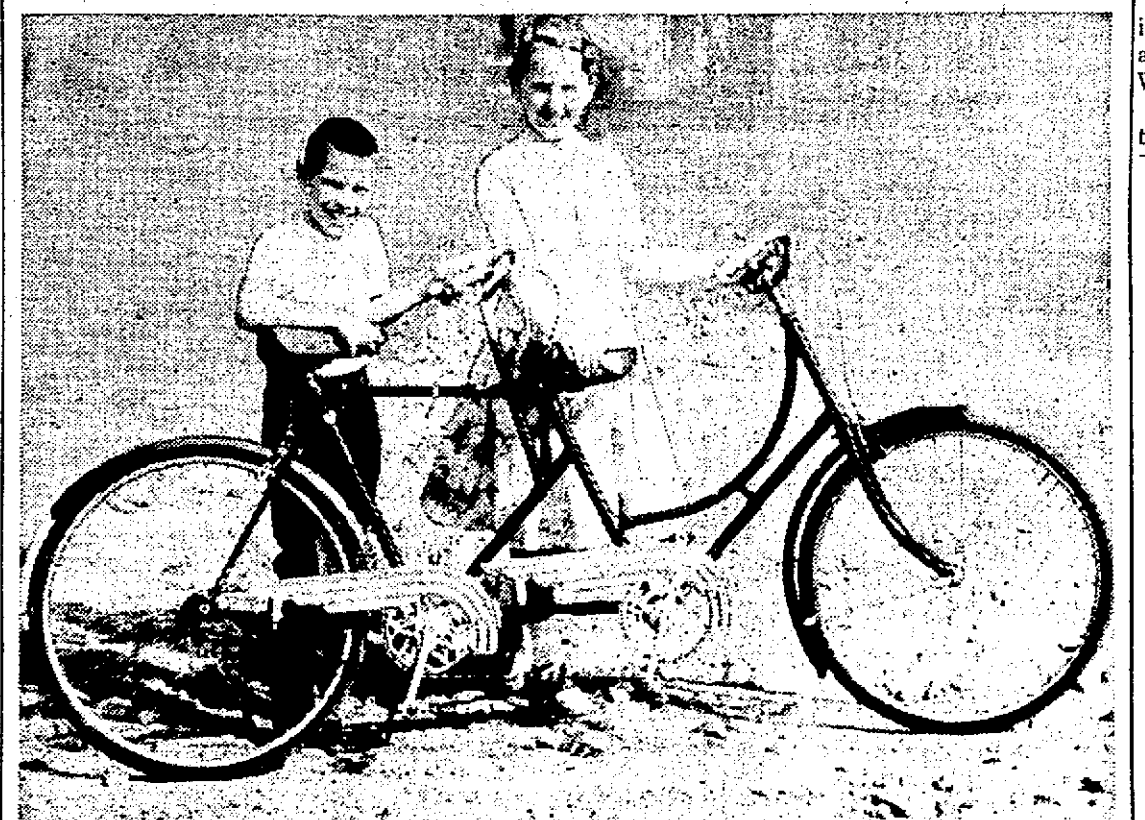
