Money's Worth . . .

**Savings In  
Food Bargains**

HOW MUCH money could you save on your food budget if you

stuck strictly to the food "bargains" on your weekly supermarket shopping trip — ignored quality and convenience, traded down instead of trading up?

To answer this question, I went through a typical supermarket last week with one shopping list and two carts. Into the "bargain" cart I put the least expensive brand of each of 5 items, and into the "splurge" cart I put the most costly brand of each.

Price alone dictated my selections, but none of the items was an advertised special. Quality was no consideration, but in most cases the nutrient value of the items was identical. For example, under milk I put eight quarts of quality fresh milk into one cart and the equivalent of dry powdered milk in the other. I picked rib steak versus club steak, an imported beer against a domestic variety, an imported olive oil versus a U. S. vegetable oil.

When I checked out my two carts, I found my bargain basket cost \$20.01 and my splurge basket came to \$36.74 — a difference of \$16.73, or 84 per cent!

THE COST of the meats and dairy products in my splurge cart was about double the cost of the same items in my bargain basket. For some items, the highest price was triple the lowest price.

**Institute New  
Grading System**

OTTAWA — The Putnam county 4-H Council is placing more emphasis on member evaluation this year, according to county Agent Don Kimmet.

The final grade for the year's work will be averaged from three sources: first, 4-H boys and girls will be interviewed at the fair by judges to determine what they have learned from their projects; second, the record book of the project, kept by the 4-H club member, and third, 4-H club advisers will grade each member on club participation, opportunities of each member, and how well he kept his project up to date.

THE THREE grades will be averaged for the years work to become part of the 4-H club member's permanent record.

The new grading system was initiated to evaluate better the growth and progress of the member during the year as well as encourage quality projects, Kimmet said.

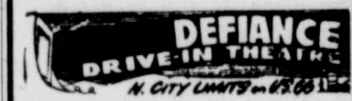

The collection tripled the goal of \$135.

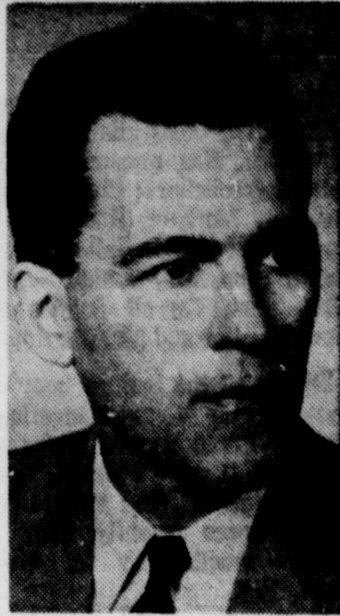
