

Local Lions attend District 13-A meet

Twenty-three Williams County Lions Club members and their wives attended the annual District 13-A Lions International convention held Saturday and Sunday at the Perrysburg Holiday Inn.

A West Virginia past International director, Ulysses Buffington was the keynote speaker at the two-day session and spoke on services to humanity provided by Lions.
