Help Offered To File For Tax Exemption

OTTAWA — Mrs. Euphemia R. Hoffman, Putnam County Auditor, has announced that she will again this year visit various banks in the county to assist taxpayers in filling out applications for Homestead Exemption. Edward Heckman,

Putnam County Treasurer, will accompany her. The following schedule has been set up:

Leipsic Bank, April 16; Pandora Bank, April 17; Continental Bank, April 18; Columbus Grove Bank, April 23; Kalida Bank, April 24; Ottoville Bank, April 30; Ft. Jennings Bank, May 1. All visits will be 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

To be eligible for Homestead Exemption, applicants must be age 65 or over this year, own or have an interest in the homestead, reside in homestead and have in income for 1972 of \$8,000 or less. Applicants are advised to take along their total amount of income for 1972, including Social Security; their Federal Income Tax Form 1040 if one is filed; proof of age and their last property tax receipt. Filing deadline for applications is the first Monday in June.
