# Construction projects total \$120 million

COLUMBUS — Over \$120 million in construction projects was approved by the Division of Factory and Building Inspection at the Department of Industrial Relations during the month of May. Included in this total were 11 projects in Defiance County totaling \$427,200. The county's major project was The State Bank and Trust Company's south side branch office at S. Jefferson and Rosewood Sts., costing \$130,000.

Director Helen Evans. "The cost of the proposed construction projects indicates 2,400 jobs should be available for Ohioans in the building and trades areas." Director Evans noted the estimated cost of proposed construction rose 40 percent in March as compared to the combined January and February estimates. The Division of Factory and Building Inspection is responsible for examining and approving building plans for public occupancy projects outside the jurisdiction of county and city certified building departments.

Between 20 and 30 people each day bring plans into the division for approval during walk-in hours. However, projects containing more than eight pages of blueprints must be mailed to the department since examination will take longer than one day. Once plans are approved, the builder or owner will receive a building permit from the department which is a go-ahead signal for construction. A division inspector will inspect the site for compliance with Ohio's building code during the construction progress and after the facility is completed.
