

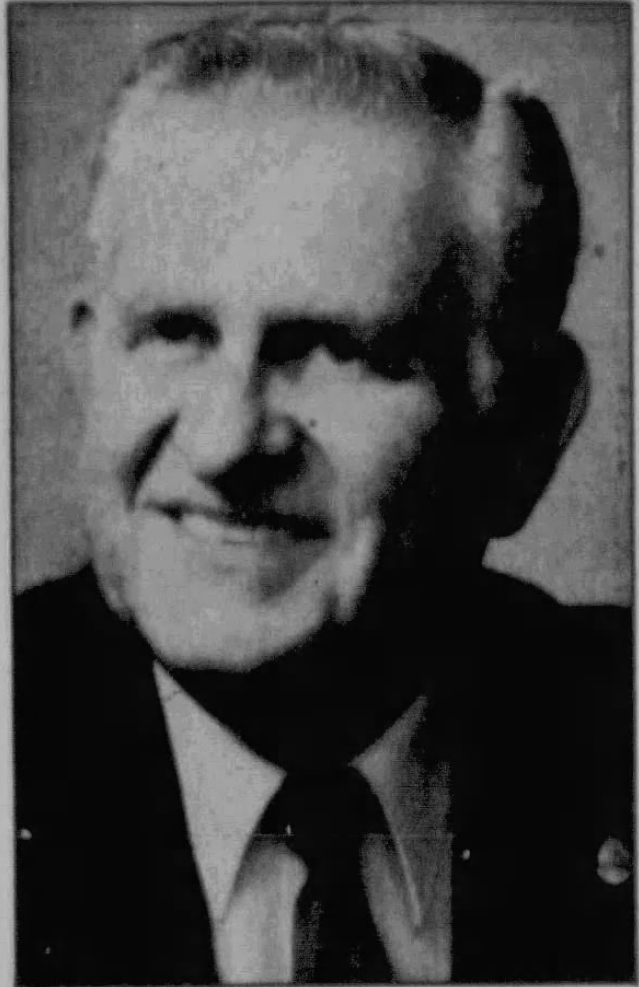
District Lions convention set
